

1.2.2. Annual Public Notification 2017

The Central Community School System (CCSS) is committed to providing a learning, living and working environment free from unlawful discrimination and to fostering a nurturing and vibrant community founded upon the fundamental dignity and worth of all of its members. Consistent with this commitment, and with all applicable laws, it is our policy not to tolerate unlawful discrimination in any form and to provide persons who feel that they are victims of discrimination with mechanisms for seeking redress.

The Central Community School System prohibits any form of discrimination against any person on the basis of race, color, sex, gender, religion, creed, marital status, national origin, disability, military status, or any other legally protected status in the administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, and employment.

Central Community School System hereby gives public notice that it is the policy of the agency to assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, Executive Order 12898 on Environmental Justice, and related statutes and regulations in all programs and activities.

Title VI requires that no person in the United States of America shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity for which CCSS receives federal funding. Any person who believes they have been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice under Title VI has a right to file a formal complaint with CCSS. Any such complaint must be in writing and filed with the CCSS Title VI Coordinator, Dr. Janet Stevens, within one hundred eighty (180) days following the date of the alleged discriminatory occurrence.
