25	Slacks/Skirts 2 -b.	<p><b>Change From:</b> Slacks will have finished bottoms and will not have elastic band at the bottom.</p> <p><b>Change To:</b> Slacks will have finished bottoms.</p>
26	Dress Code	<p><b>Add:</b> Choker elastic accessories are prohibited. (new "d")</p>
27	Slacks/Skirts 2 -b.	<p><b>Change From:</b> Shorts no greater than 2 inches above the knee can be worn at Central Middle and Central High School.</p> <p><b>Change To:</b> Shorts no less than a 9 inch inseam shall be worn at Central Middle School and Central High School.</p>
27	Over Garments 4 -a	<p><b>From:</b> Maroon, black, gray, or white sweatshirts without pockets will be allowed, (6-12 grades). These sweatshirts may have hoods, but the hoods cannot be worn in the building. Jackets may have more than one color (as long as they are school colors – black, white, gray, maroon). Jackets may have a logo no more than three inches (i.e. North Face logo or small Nike check-mark would be acceptable). A child's monogram is okay as long as it is in a school color and fits the three inch requirement. The only over garment allowed over the uniform shirt, will be a sweatshirt, jacket, or letter-jackets in cold weather. No other outer garments are allowed to be worn in the building. Sweatshirts will be allowed to have approved school organizations logos printed on them. Trench coats will not be worn. The uniform shirt must be worn under any cold weather over garment. Long sleeved shirts under the uniform shirt are not allowed.</p> <p><b>TO:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Central High over garments (sweatshirts, warm-ups, letter jackets, etc.) must be on the principal-approved over garment list.</li> <li>b. Central Middle over garments – Must be sweatshirts either plain or with a Central logo.</li> <li>c. Students at Central Middle School may wear jackets so long as they are some combination of black, white, gray, and maroon. Jackets may have a logo no more than three inches (i.e. North Face logo or small Nike check-mark would be acceptable). A child's monogram is okay as long as it is in a school color and fits the three inch requirement.</li> <li>d. Students at Central High School are expected to remove jackets upon entering the building. The only exceptions are jackets on the principal-approved over garment list.</li> <li>e. Long sleeved shirts under the uniform shirt must match the color of the uniform shirt.</li> </ol>

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27	Dress Code 5 –a.	<b>Add:</b> A current school ID must be worn around the neck and visible at all times. (make a new “a”)
28	e.	<b>Change From:</b> Student hair must not obstruct his/her vision. Boy’s hair cannot be longer than shoulder length.  <b>Remove:</b> Boy’s hair cannot be longer than shoulder length.
30	Due Process 6	<b>Add:</b> A student who commits a major offense may have his/her schedule changed at the discretion of school officials. (new “k”)
30	6	<b>Add:</b> Shares or post videos or images of fights, assaults, bullying or other major offense (new “l”)
39	4	<b>Add: Elementary &amp; Middle School</b> - Students are prohibited to have a Cell phone on school property.
40	Parking Violations	<b>Add: Central High School Parking</b> <b>Parking Violations:</b> Vehicle will have the boot installed <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Not having the parking tag visible in the front of the car</li> <li>• Not parking in correct parking lot</li> <li>• Parking on the outside of the gravel lot</li> <li>• Parking in the grass in the front of the school</li> <li>• Driving recklessly</li> </ul> <b>1<sup>st</sup> Violation</b> – Saturday School or pay <b>\$20</b> <b>2<sup>nd</sup> Violation</b> – 2 Saturday Schools/lose parking privileges for 2 weeks or pay <b>\$40</b> <b>3<sup>rd</sup> Violation</b> – lose parking privileges for the rest of the year
43	5-vi	<b>From:</b> Testing Standard: The program coordinator shall determine the method of testing to be utilized for each random drug testing event However, initial testing will be by hair analysis.  <b>TO:</b> Testing Standard: The program coordinator shall determine the method of testing to be utilized for each random drug testing event However, initial testing will be by <u>urine</u> /hair analysis

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	Vii Testing Procedures	<b>Add:</b> to #1: For urine testing, each student will provide a urine sample at the direction of staff in a container provided to them. The collection is unobserved, but to be valid it must meet specimen specifications for color, temperature, and concentration. A student will have a three-hour window to produce a valid specimen. If a student is unable to produce a valid specimen within the specified three hour time-frame (such as from shy bladder, or due to an excessively dilute, off-temperature, or contaminated sample), alternative testing method will be used. (Example: Hair testing)
