

Central Community School District Uniform and Dress Code for
Central Middle School and **Central High School**.

The standard uniform includes the following:

Shirts

1. Shirts will be maroon in color. Shirts will have a collar and short sleeves. Shirts will be plain, with no pockets, writing, emblems, or designs of any kind except a standard school logo. The standard logo is optional. The logo will consist of white, three-quarter inch block letters, monogrammed on the left side. No other logos will be used. White, gray or black T-shirts will be worn underneath the uniform shirts and will not extend past sleeve length.
2. Shirts will be tucked in and must be long enough to stay tucked when the arms are raised above the head. The style will be pullover with two, three, or four buttons at the top. Shirts will not be excessively worn, faded, or frayed and will not have holes or cuts.

Slacks/Skirts

1. Slacks and skirts will be khaki in color and of the specified shade. The shade is khaki. The lighter stone color is not acceptable. The dark chocolate brown color and the dark green color are also not acceptable. They will not be rolled at either the waist or cuffs.
2. Slacks are uniform. There should be no designer labels on slacks. Slacks will have belt loops and will be worn with a belt. The belt will be brown, black, khaki, or white with no decals or labels and will not be wider than one inch. Belt buckles shall be no larger than 1 ½ inches square. Slacks will have two pockets in front and two in the back. "Cargo" style pants are not acceptable. Slacks will have finished bottoms. Cuffs are acceptable. There will be no flared or bell-bottoms. Holes, cuts, or frayed edges are prohibited. Slacks must be worn at the waist as designed. No jeans, bike shorts, stretch pants, or sweatpants will be worn. **CAPRI PANTS and Shorts Can BE WORN At The Central Middle School.**
3. Skirts are acceptable if loose fitting and worn no higher than the top of the knee cap. Shorts/Skorts may not be worn.
4. Corduroy fabric is not allowed. Corduroy is cotton pile fabric with vertical ribs or wales.

Shoes

1. Shoes with closed toe and closed heel are required. Loafers, oxfords, and athletic style shoes are acceptable. Socks will be worn. Boots may be worn with slacks, provided the slacks are worn over the boot. Pants may be cut one inch from the

bottom. They must be hemmed. Slacks will not be tucked into the boots.

2. Sandals, flip-flops, house shoes, and similar type shoes are not acceptable. Shoes with heels two inches or higher or excessively-raised soles are not acceptable for safety reasons.
3. Socks will be worn. Sock colors are white, black, khaki, brown and maroon. Female students may substitute stocking for socks.
4. Socks must be worn and matching.

Over Garments

Maroon sweatshirts either pullover or zippered will be allowed. These sweatshirts may have hoods, but the hoods cannot be worn in the building and will be the only over garment allowed over the uniform shirt, except for letter-jackets in cold weather. No other outer garments are allowed to be worn in the building. Maroon sweatshirts will be allowed to have logos printed on them. These must represent approved school organizations. Trench coats will not be worn. The uniform shirt must be worn under any cold weather over garment. Long sleeved shirts under the uniform shirt are not allowed.

Students in approved school organizations will be allowed to wear school approved non-uniform shirts on special occasions. The occasions will be approved by the principal or his designee. The remainder of the uniform policy and dress code would remain in effect for these days. For example, shirts would continue to be tucked in, and ID cards, where applicable, worn - even though the shirt would be non-uniform.

Dress Code

1. Caps, hats, or head coverings are NOT to be worn during the school day, or inside the school building. **DO NOT BRING CAPS OR HATS ON CAMPUS DURING SCHOOL TIME.**
2. Male students are not to wear earrings or straws to preserve the pierced hole. Girls are allowed to wear two pairs of earrings. Earrings cannot be greater than one inch in diameter. Hanging earrings cannot be longer than one inch. Body piercing and tongue rings are NOT allowed. Only simple jewelry may be worn.
3. **Girls may wear headbands, ribbons, or bows that must be maroon, white, gray, black, or khaki.**
4. Rollers, curlers, picks, rakes, forks, or combs in hair are prohibited.
5. Unnatural coloring of hair or cutting of symbols or designs in hair is prohibited. (Mohawks, symbols, designs, etc.)

6. Beards and goatees are NOT allowed. Sideburns must be no longer than the bottom of the ear and mustaches must be neat and well trimmed.
7. Sunglasses are not to be worn on school grounds unless prescribed for medical purposes and verified with a doctor's note. This note must be presented to an administrator for approval.
8. Pictures or writing on book sacks, gym bags, jackets, etc. of an offensive, derogatory, or obscene nature is prohibited at school (e.g., alcohol, tobacco, drugs, weapons, blood, skulls, etc.).
9. Grills and fake teeth are not allowed.
10. Sports headbands and sweatbands are not allowed.
11. Visible tattoos are not allowed.

IN THE OPINION OF THE ADMINISTRATION, STUDENTS WHOSE CLOTHING OR GROOMING IS INAPPROPRIATE WILL BE SENT HOME TO MAKE THE PROPER ADJUSTMENT. UNEXCUSED ABSENCES WILL BE GIVEN WHEN STUDENTS ARE SENT HOME TO TAKE CARE OF ANY OF THE ABOVE POLICIES. STUDENTS WHO VIOLATE SET DRESS AND GROOMING POLICIES SHALL ALSO BE SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINARY ACTION. (Time out Room, Saturday School, or the Discipline Center Suspension)
